Computer Science

The fastest-growing subject area in the UK, the interest in computing degrees comes amid the rise in the popularity of AI and gaming, and with advances such as ChatGPT coming to the market. As a UCAS subject group computing received 195,690 applications in 2023, up 9% on 2022 and up 26% on 2021. Courses encompass a broad area, taking in everything from computer science and software engineering to AI, video games design and animation.

Job security in an evolving industrial landscape is part of the appeal. Thirty universities report at least 90% of their computer science graduates as being in high-skilled jobs or postgraduate study within 15 months. Oxford, in first place of our table, achieves a perfect 100%. Job prospects for computer science graduates are pretty good throughout the table, with only 17 of the 114 universities registering rates of high-skilled work/postgraduate study beneath 70%. As a whole, computer sciences ranks 26th out of our employment ranking's 70 subject areas. Although earnings are not an ingredient of our main subject rankings, part of the appeal of degrees within computer science is their promise of enticing graduate pay cheques and starting salaries of £29,860 rank the subject 14th out of 70 in our pay index.

Cambridge, which topped the table for the past two years, sits third. Imperial secured the best results in computer science in our analysis of the Research Excellence Framework 2021, followed by Oxford. Led by Cambridge and St Andrews, which each averaged 220 UCAS points among entrants, there are six universities where entry standards tip over 200 UCAS points. Students at Bolton (in =66th place overall) expressed the highest rates of satisfaction with teaching quality, while those at East London (=95th) were the most satisfied with the broad experience.

Tom Curtin, industrial liaison officer, Department of Computing, Imperial College London notes: "Computer scientists have provided the digital systems at the heart of everything we do, driven the technology sector providing the basis for almost every trillion-dollar company to emerge over the past decade and, in the near future, will be at the helm of the next industrial revolution, driven by AI." Applicants are advised to ensure their maths skills are up to scratch, keep abreast of technology and data science news, and experiment with new computing technologies. Computing as a whole remains a male-dominated field, with only 18% of all UK 18-year-olds' applications made by females – although this is higher than the 17% in 2022 and 16% in 2021.

Creative Writing

Taking the lead in our new Creative Writing table, Newcastle has the top research in the field, based on results of the Research Excellence Framework 2021. After two years at No 1, Warwick takes second place but continues to claim the highest entry standards of 165 UCAS points. Creative writing students tend to enjoy their studies, as represented in our latest National Student Survey analysis, which shows high rates of satisfaction with teaching quality throughout the table. These are topped at Anglia Ruskin, which places 15th overall. Arts University, Bournemouth does best for students' evaluation of the broader experience.

"Creative writing provides an opportunity to study literature by creating your own work. You'll learn to read and write with attention to themes and ideas and an eye on technique, structure and more. You will create work that interacts with the world around you, exploring and understanding yourself and other people," says Dr Douglas Cowie, senior lecturer in the Department of English, Royal Holloway, University of London.

Applicants to creative writing courses may not be motivated by immediate professional full-time employment upon graduation, which is perhaps why only 25 of the 43 universities tabled a postgraduate prospects score. Of these, Bournemouth does best based on 83.3% of its graduates being employed in high-skilled work and/or further study within 15 months – a proportion which falls to 48.8% at Chichester. As a whole, creative writing has lost five places to sit at the foot of our employment ranking of 70 subject areas this year. More than four in ten graduates were in high-skilled work and/or further study when surveyed 15 months after their degrees, but three in ten were in jobs deemed "low-skilled" and around one in ten were unemployed – the highest unemployment rate of any subject group. Creative writing is also bottom of the salaries table, jointly with animal science.

Even so, the demand for creative writing courses registered a second consecutive uplift in 2022, when more than 8,100 applied for degrees. New student enrolments went marginally in the opposite direction however, and just under 1,800 undergraduates were accepted onto creative writing programmes. In 2025–26, 113 universities and colleges are offering the subject.
