## Radiography

"There are two radiography disciplines – diagnostic and therapeutic," explains Dr Jane Harvey-Lloyd, associate professor in diagnostic radiography, School of Medicine, University of Leeds. "Diagnostics uses a range of imaging modalities to diagnose illness and disease. Therapeutics uses methods like ionising radiation to treat mainly cancer. New technology is continuously emerging, providing new ways to diagnose and treat illness and disease. If you are considering a dynamic career that combines cutting-edge technology with caring for others, radiography is for you."

Diagnostic courses usually involve two years of studying anatomy, physiology and physics, followed by further training in oncology, psycho-social studies and other modules. Candidates need at least one science A-level, or equivalent, usually biology. Graduates of radiography can rest assured that professional-level work is on the horizon soon after university, with radiography invariably featuring in the top 10 of our employment ranking – where it is up four places to rank fourth this year. Exeter, Leeds, Robert Gordon, Canterbury Christ Church, Teesside and Derby achieved perfect 100% graduate prospects scores, due to every one of their radiography graduates being employed in professional jobs and/or postgraduate study within 15 months. Only one university, St George's, London (now City St George's), had fewer than nine in ten graduates achieving the desired career outcomes at the same point of survey, and it still tallied a respectable 84% rate. For pay, radiography compares less strongly with other subjects, but is comfortably in the upper half of our 70-subject salaries index.

For the third consecutive year, Glasgow Caledonian leads our dedicated ranking for radiography degrees, now in its 12th edition having previously been listed among "Subjects Allied to Medicine" in the *Guide*. It does best in both measures derived from the National Student Survey (NSS): teaching quality and the wider undergraduate experience and its radiography entrants average the highest entry standards. Former winner Leeds takes fourth

place this year, while Queen Margaret, Edinburgh is runner-up for the second year in a row. Strength in research is unbeaten at Keele (=14th overall) which achieved the top scores in the recent Research Excellence Framework 2021, followed by Leeds. Our National Student Survey analysis shows the two universities of St George's, London and City – which have since merged to form City St George's University – to share second and third place for teaching quality and the wider experience. Conversely, Plymouth comes bottom for the student experience and Keele is at the foot of the table for teaching quality.
